WHAT IS CIVIL LEGAL AID?

Civil legal aid connects Alaskans to legal help to protect their livelihoods, health and families. Civil legal aid ensures fairness for all Alaskans in the legal system, regardless of income or economic status. Civil legal aid includes low cost and free lawyers, self-help resources, free legal clinics, and access to internet information and forms.

HOW DO I FIND A LAWYER WHO CAN HELP ME?

If you want to hire a lawyer, you have several options:



Some lawyers provide "unbundled" legal services, meaning that they are willing to help with only part of your case.

Call the Alaska Bar Association Lawyer Referral Service to get names and phone numbers of lawyers.

WHAT IF I CAN'T AFFORD A LAWYER?

There are agencies that provide low cost or free legal services for specific types of cases. See "Resources" section.

IF I DECIDE I DON'T WANT A LAWYER, BUT STILL WANT HELP WHAT CAN I DO?

The Alaska Court System has forms, websites and information for people who are representing themselves in many case types. The Court's Family Law Self-Help Center has a telephone hotline that provides information and forms about divorce, custody and child support cases.

Some agencies operate free legal clinics and hotlines that can provide advice and information for certain types of cases.
