What are the Benefits of Juneau Therapeutic Court?

Reduced jail time and fines
Possible dismissal of the case
Swift access to substance abuse assessments & treatment
Assistance with housing & job search
Safer roads & communities
Eligibility for limited license

What is Juneau Therapeutic Court?

Juneau Therapeutic Court helps felony and misdemeanor defendants who want to overcome a serious addiction. The Juneau Therapeutic Court is a jail diversion program which offers intensive substance abuse treatment and community supervision to support participants' abstinence and recovery.

Who is Eligible and How do I Get Referred?

A defendant is eligible to be considered for the Juneau Therapeutic Court if the defendant is:

Charged with a felony or misdemeanor drug or drug-related charge or
Charged with a felony DUI and
Assessed as needing intensive outpatient substance abuse treatment.

Entry into the Court is not automatic but is based on state prosecutor approval and treatment assessment. Contact the Project Coordinator (contact information on other side) or your defense attorney for an application form.

How Much does it Cost?

Program fees are based on a sliding scale and some additional financial assistance may be available. You may also be required to access electronic monitoring.

How does Juneau Therapeutic Court Work?

The Juneau Therapeutic Court is an intensive 12 to 18 month program. Participants are required to:

Attend intensive outpatient substance abuse treatment and other services as recommended
Attend recovery support groups such as AA or NA
Attend regular compliance hearings before the Juneau Therapeutic Court judge
Attend regularly scheduled meetings with their Probation Officers
Be employed or attend school for a minimum of 24 hours a week
Undergo regular alcohol and drug testing
Maintain sobriety
Pay program fees
