## ORDER RE: ANCHORAGE DISTRICT COURT <u>PRETRIAL CONFERENCE CONTINUANCES</u>

As of January 9, 2024, there are at least 1,516<sup>1</sup> criminal cases in the Anchorage District Court over 365 days old. In order to address this backlog, and avoid a expanding the backlog with 2024 cases, all 2024 district court criminal cases will be allowed a total of no more than three continuances. For 2023 and older cases, no further continuances will be granted unless the parties provide a good cause basis. The Court shall place findings on the record pursuant to CrR12(h). Prior to the pandemic, the average time between arraignment and final disposition of a case was 90 days. Given the backlog, the Court expects district court cases to be resolved within 6 months, absent extraordinary circumstances.
