Amending Bar Rules 2, 4, and 5 to lower the Uniform Bar Examination (UBE) passing and admission score from 280 to 270.

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Bar Rule 2 is amended to read as follows:

Rule 2. Eligibility for Admission.*

* * * *

Section 4. An applicant who meets the requirements of (a) through (e) of Section 1 of this Rule or meets the requirements of Section 3 of this Rule, and has achieved a scaled score of <u>270</u> <u>280</u> or above on a Uniform Bar Examination (UBE) administered in <u>any another</u> state, territory, or the District of Columbia within five years preceding the date of the application to the Alaska Bar Association may be admitted to the Alaska Bar Association.

2. Bar Rule 4 is amended to read as follows:

Rule 4. Examinations.

* * * *

Section 6. A scaled score of <u>270 280</u> or above, as calculated by the National Conference of Bar Examiners, shall be the passing grade on the bar examination.

3. Bar Rule 5 is amended to read as follows:

Rule 5. Requirements for Admission to the Practice of Law

Section 1. (a) To be admitted to the practice of law in Alaska, an applicant must

(1) pass the bar examination prescribed pursuant to Rule 4; be excused from taking the bar examination under Rule 2, Section 2; or transfer a UBE scaled score of <u>270 280</u> or above achieved on a UBE administered in <u>any another</u>-state, territory, or the District of Columbia within five years preceding the date of the application to the Alaska Bar Association;
