ORDER NO. 273

Amending Rule 40(a),
Rules of Criminal Procedure
relating to computation of
periods of time.

IT IS ORDERED:

Rule 40(a), Rules of Criminal Procedure, is amended to
read:

(a) Computation. Except as otherwise specifically provided in these rules, in computing any period of time, the day of the act or event after which the designated period of time begins to run is not to be included. The last day of the period so computed is to be included, unless it is a Saturday, a Sunday, or a legal holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. When a period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven days, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be excluded in the computation. A half holiday shall be considered as other days and not as a holiday.
