ORDER NO. 278

Amending Rule 8, Rules
Governing the Administration
of All Courts, by increasing
the fee for court interpreter
services.

IT IS ORDERED:

Paragraph (a) of Rule 8, Rules Governing the Administration
of All Courts, is amended to read:

(a) Amount. The fee for an interpreter or
translator for attendance in any court or
at a coroner's inquest shall be set by that
court. The fee shall be subject to the
following limitations:

(1) For time spent in actual
performance of interpreter or
translator services during the
proceedings, an hourly fee not
to exceed \$15.00 per hour; and

(2) For standby time during
which the interpreter or trans-
lator is required by the court
to be in attendance at the court
facility, an hourly fee not to
exceed \$7.50 per hour.

The court shall not authorize the maximum hourly rate unless the interpreter or translator has had formal training in court interpreting or has demonstrated specialized language skills beyond mere bilingual ability.
